Portable Ultrasound Machine at Oilfields General Hospital

Used by the physician population, the unique advantages of point of care (POC) ultrasound includes rapid assessment of critically ill patients presenting with a variety of symptoms, such as chest pain, shortness of breath, undifferentiated hypo-tension, internal organ pain, pregnancy related issues and various other traumas. With faster access to an ultrasound there is increased efficiencies in treatment and management of care, help minimize length of stay within the Hospital, or reduce the need for transport to an urban Emergency Department.

School Meal Program

We currently have 12 schools in the program, ranging from Elementary to High School in the communities of Okotoks, Black Diamond, Turner Valley, Millarville and Longview. Our local schools had approached us as they had identified a need for a school meal program designed to address concerns that some children were going to school hungry. Schools participating in School Meal design their own program to meet the needs of their school population. Hunger detracts from learning. Last year the School Meal Program provided 28,658 meals.





Rural Pediatric Allied Health Equipment

Swedish Wall bars a Pikler Climber are used by physiotherapists and occupational therapists during treatment sessions with children of all ages (0-18 years) and with a variety of developmental and motor challenges. In particular, these treatment tools are helpful supporting children with mild developmental delays to children who have severe challenges with movement. This equipment results in improving the quality of therapeutic interventions for our patients who access services out of Okotoks Wellness Centre.

Okotoks Public Library- Surfing Seniors

Providing seniors the opportunity to check-out Digital Literacy Kits, which include Chromebook laptop, Wifi Hotspot, and unlimited data. This program allows seniors, who may be shut off from the digital world because of computer access, internet connectivity or digital skills, to virtually connect with loved ones, read online newspapers, listen to audiobooks, access government programs or connect with Healthcare workers.
